The Council recently consulted with residents on proposals to improve road safety in Groesfaen by the installation of a Puffin type Pedestrian crossing on the A4119, waiting restrictions and amendments to the junction of Y Parc and the A4119 to improve visibility for drivers as they egress from Y Parc.

Details of both proposals are shown on the enclosed drawings P256-00-85-01 and P256-00-85-02 which may also be viewed at <u>www.rctcbc.gov.uk/traffic</u>

219 letters were sent out and 58 responses received. 55 responded in support of the crossing with 28 including additional comments. 3 objections were received.

While many of the comments were outside of the remit of the scheme, it should also be noted that, while there was support for the crossing, some respondents queried the location of the crossing with the general opinion that it should be moved further east.

When introducing a crossing, the council refers to Local Transport Note 2/95 which provides clear guidelines on the installation of pedestrian crossings.

LTN 2/95 includes a minimum clear visibility to the crossing and in order to meet with this requirement it is not always possible to locate a crossing at a location preferred by residents. Moving the crossing further east would reduce the clear visibility distance to below the minimum required to the detriment of road safety. Therefore it is not proposed to re-locate the crossing.
