Welcome to the April 2023- March 2024 Foster Carer Training calendar. Courses are available to all Foster, kinship/connected persons and SGO carers within Merthyr Tydfil and Rhondda Cynon Taf.

All the training set out reflects the learning outcomes from the post approval learning and development framework for foster carers. It is your responsibility as foster carers to keep this plan up to date following any training you complete, and it should then be saved on Source so your supervising social workers can sign off in supervision sessions. Make sure you are aware of the training hours you need to complete, there are set hours for primary and secondary carers, please chat with your link worker about this. If you have not got a copy of your learning and development plan, please pop me an email.

It is essential that any training you wish to attend is discussed and agreed with your supervising social worker prior to booking on. Your training should be targeted to meet any training needs that you have identified in your personal learning and development plan.

Thank you to everyone who contributed to the TNA survey sent around at Christmas time, this has helped me to shape the calendar this year. We are going for a blended learning calendar again this year so there is a mixture of face to face and zoom courses. We have some E-learning licences, and these will be prioritised to those foster carers who work full time and are unable to attend the face to face or online courses. If you require any further information on this, please send me an email.

All training course places needed to be secured via Source. Please do not turn up to a training event if you are not booked on. You can check all your booked courses via Source.

If you are booked onto a training course but are for whatever reason you are unable to attend, please cancel your place via source as this will free up a space for another foster carer who may need the training. If the night before or on the morning of the course you are ill or unable to attend please email ellie.powell@rctcbc.gov.uk or emma.baylis@rctcbc.gov.uk



Parking.

Parking is extremely limited in Rock Grounds but there are always spaces at the Gadlys car park and <u>a permit can be provided for this</u>. The permits will need to be collected from the Annexe building in Rock Grounds (opposite training building). Please find below a map of where you can park if you are training in Rock Grounds.





Attending training on a virtual platform.

- Please join using the link sent via email by the course administrator. Emma sends out all course links at least the day before the training event. If you know you have online training coming up, please ensure you have received the link the day before the training course.
- You may have been sent pre-course materials, please read these documents to prepare for the session.
- Make sure that you join us using a functioning electronic device such as laptop or PC and try to familiarise yourself with the training platform prior to the event. If you need any help with this, please us know.
- Make sure that your camera is on throughout the session and place your microphone on mute, unless requested otherwise (such as during group sessions). This ensures there are fewer distracting background noises for all participants.
- The trainer will outline any other general housekeeping rules around virtual etiquette, at the beginning of the session.
- The trainer will explain how introductions will be made either verbally or via the 'chat' facility.
- Please 'join in', active participation is vital to a successful learning experience.
- Use the chat function to pose any questions to the trainer, these will be addressed at various points during the event at the trainer's discretion.
- Please be mindful that if there are children home whilst you are attending online training that some of the content may not be suitable for them to hear so, please make sure you plan for this.

Why is training essential?

As professionals we have a responsibility to continue to develop our knowledge and skills, particularly in research, legislation and policies on children and young people are continually developing and changing! As foster carers, you all have the post approval learning and development framework that you need to work towards.

What happens at training events?

Activities such as group discussion and group exercises are designed to provide you with optimum opportunities for learning and encouraging you to explore and reflect on some of your own experiences as carers.

Our pledge to you.

We will ensure that all carers will be treated equally, and we will endeavour to offer everyone a place on the courses they would like to attend. If we cannot offer you a place on the course, you can add your name to the waiting list via source and this will allow us to know you want to sit the course and when a place becomes available then you will automatically be added, so please keep an eye on the course via source. We aim to start and finish each course on time to enable you to maintain your commitments and we will only cancel a course if there is no other option and will make sure that you are informed as soon as possible. Cancellations will often be sent via email so please keep a regular eye on your emails.

Training expectations. (Conduct and respect).

We expect all participants to treat the trainers, business support staff and one another with dignity and respect, we would also expect you to:

Arrive promptly and stay until the end of the course. Turning up late or leaving early to a training session can disrupt the flow for the facilitator.

We acknowledge that mobile phones are required for urgent calls, so please limit the use, and put on vibrate/silent during the training.

Discriminatory or oppressive comments will not be tolerated.

Inform us if there are any specific learning needs.

If you are unable to attend a course either cancel your place via Source or contact us (Ellie and Emma) straight away so we can offer the space to another foster carer.

Booking a training course.

Having identified your training needs with your supervising social worker you can then book on to the course via your Source account. If you don't have your source log in detail, please pop me an email.

Cancellation of course place.

We understand that from time-to-time things crop up and so you may find you can't attend training, if this is the case then please log onto your Source account to cancel your course place. Our course spaces are extremely limited, and from time to time we

do have waiting lists so if you cancel early enough, we can potentially offer that space to someone else. If it is the morning of the training event, please still email Emma and/or I as the facilitator may be waiting for you to turn up, therefore holding other people up. The reason we ask this is sadly we have paid lots of money for could this be, external facilitators may not deliver below a pre agreed number or low numbers mean cancellation and each course is paid for out of grant funding, when this occurs this money can't be recouped. It is also difficult if courses are cancelled for those who have made an effort to attend. Cancellation means they are sent home or notified at a very late point in the day.

Types of training and learning opportunities.

Cwm Taf Social Care Workforce Development Service recognises that there are a wide variety of training and learning opportunities available for foster carers which can be delivered in a variety of formats to meet post approval learning and development framework requirements. There is an expectation that foster carers will access the face-to-face training provided in this calendar, but we also recognise that foster carers may also access training from other sources such as their work or through personal research and where this is relevant to their role as a foster carer this can be included in their learning and development plan.

Formal training

This includes formal classroom training sessions with other foster carers and professionals provided by Cwm Taf, specific conferences and training courses run by external organisations.

E-learning/ online training

This includes online courses accessed through our e-learning programme; information that foster carers have obtained via the internet and courses run by external organisations. This must be evidenced by certificates and through discussion with your supervising social worker on how it relates to your practice as a foster carer.

Independent learning

This includes reporting/documentaries on the radio, TV or in the newspaper that foster carers have listened to or read. This must be evidenced through discussion with your supervising social worker on how it relates to your practice as a foster carer.

Support groups

Support groups for foster carers provide a valuable opportunity for foster carers to meet, share concerns, reflect on practice, and develop their learning. Foster carers are encouraged to attend these groups.

Post approval learning and development framework for foster carers.

CORE: These learning and development opportunities are deemed as being an essential foundation for all foster carers.

Some outcomes are specified within the regulations and will require updating in accordance with local policy.

Foster Carers may require additional learning and development opportunities at any point to ensure that they can meet the needs of the children and young people in their care.

ADDITIONAL: These learning and development opportunities build upon the core foundations and reflect the development needs of individual foster carers.

Foster Carers may require additional learning and development opportunities at any point to ensure that they can meet the needs of the children and young people in their care.

It is recognised that other opportunities outside of this framework may be required to meet specific needs.

SPECIFIC: There may be need for foster carers to access specific learning and development opportunities to meet the needs of the children placed with them or their own personal development. These may be access at any time during their journey through the Post Approval Learning and Development Framework. These are not necessarily in the calendar but if there is a specific need please talk to your social worker/ ACM and make a training request to the department.
