What are we trying to achieve, the outcome	Provide sustainable environmental health services which meet the Council's statutory duties in terms of public health	
Why we need to do it:	Councils have a range of statutory environmental health duties that they are required to deliver. These range from tackling overcrowding and poor housing conditions to testing for air pollution and checking the quality of food premises. However, because of reductions in UK government funding for the Welsh Government and councils, local authorities have less money to maintain these services and support delivery of national improvement priorities.

The Best Practice Standards were developed by the Wales Heads of Environmental Health Group (WHOEHG), under direction from Directors of Public Protection Wales. Following the WAO Report recommendation, a comprehensive review of the standards has been started with a view to this work being completed by April 2016. In view of the financial challenges faced by Local Government Environmental Health Services, the revised standards will no longer refer to "good" or "best" practice and will identify required standard and the higher standard that may be achieved at local discretion. Rhondda Cynon Taf CBC is actively contributing to this work through the network of Expert Panels established by WHOEHG.
