The Electoral Commission is offering training sessions for people wishing to stand as independent candidates in this year's Local Government Elections in Wales.

Rhydian Thomas, Head of the Electoral Commission's Wales Office said: "It's important that those considering standing as a candidate in the upcoming Local Government Elections in Wales are fully aware of the rules and regulations in place.

"We look forward to working with the respective local authorities, and with prospective candidates, to ensure that this information is communicated effectively, making the process of standing for election as straightforward as possible."
