The Council is proposing to change the way it provides Home to School Transport (HTS) for children and young people (learners) in Rhondda Cynon Taf. The proposal sets out a new Home to School Transport Policy, which primarily maintains the generous discretionary transport and providing mainstream English, Welsh and Faith primary school, secondary school and college transport in line with relevant statutory distance criteria, which would be implemented from the start of the 2025/2026 academic year.

PROPOSAL

To continue to provide a generous discretionary Home to School

Transport Provision for over 6000 learners and bring mainstream English,

Welsh and Faith primary and secondary school and college transport in

line with statutory distance criteria.

This option has the potential to deliver savings of approximately £2.5m in a full year.

Currently, the Council provides Home to School Transport to all pupils who live 1.5 miles away from their Primary School and 2 miles from their Secondary School. This is above the statutory legal requirement set out by Welsh Government.

In the current financial climate and to protect a significant element of the current discretionary provision, if the service change is approved, the Council will provide Home to School Transport to all pupils who live 2 miles or more away from their Primary School and 3 miles or more away from their Secondary School. This service change would put the Council's transport policy in line with Welsh Government's statutory distance eligibility criteria and statutory walking distance policy, which 18 of the 22 Councils in Wales currently adopt.

Under this proposal, the Council will still continue to offer and protect large elements of the very generous discretionary service and provide transport over and above the statutory distances. This includes transport for pre compulsory school age pupils, post 16 pupils attending 6th forms or college, and for pupils attending Welsh Medium or Faith schools.

Transport eligibility for learners with Additional Learning Needs who attend special schools, pupil referral units and learning support classes will not change as a result of this proposal.

Approximately 6,000 learners will continue to benefit from this generous discretionary transport policy, at an estimated cost of £4.4m per year.

The following table outlines what the Council would continue to provide for all other areas of its discretionary transport provision in excess of the current minimum Welsh Government statutory requirement.
