




Resident Support & Assistance

One Community Asset Transfer completed this quarter with a long term lease agreed for Lee Gardens Pool Group who will now manage **Penrhiwceiber OAP** Welfare Hall.

The group have successfully levered in circa £86.000+ of capital funding to refurbish the hall and car park area, with work due to complete by 31/3/24



Spotlight on.... "Hwb Cana" - Penywaun

Coalfields Regeneration Trust (CRT) secured the freehold of the former Cana Centre (Penywaun) back in 2021.

Since then, they have levered in capital funding of £346,000+ to transform the centre which was officially re-opened on 29th April 2023 as a Skills and Training Centre. CRT continue to engage and consult the community to help shape future courses and services available from the Hwb. https://www.facebook.com/HwbCanaPenywaun/

They have also secured 3 long term tenants 1) Smart Money Cymru Community Bank 2) CRT Together - Improving the Cancer Journey and 3) Tower Colliery all offering a diverse range of services to help meet the needs of residents in Peynwaun.

The group advised positives was the support received from both the RCT Together Team and Corporate Estates who understood the process and challenges and were on hand for support and guidance.

Challenges have included timescales, increased refurbishment costs post covid, grant funding being paid in arrears and delays in installing the lift to make the building accessible.

CRT were fortunate to receive funding from UKG Community Ownership Fund, Welsh Government Community Facilities Programme, Pen Y Cymoedd Windfarm Fund and UKG Shared Prosperity Funding – RCT Community Grant along with a generous donation of furniture and IT equipment from General Dynamic UK

This guarter the team received 40 enquiries for information and support. Staff

engaged with 49 community groups and facilitated 74 meetings. 52 CAT enquiries are ongoing. II enquiries for support have been completed & closed. 4 CAT Monitoring visits have taken place

This guarter we have advertised 2 surplus Council assets for potential Community Asset Transfer via the 30 Day Window of **Opportunity Process** Buildings - Asset transfer opportunities

1) Llantwit Fardre Leisure **Centre** and 2) Cambrian Avenue Community Centre in Gilfach Goch.

5 Expressions of Interest were received in total for the both sites and key organisations have been invited to the next stage to submit costed and evidenced business cases by April 2024.

Community Asset Transfers – Community Group Support

Spotlight on.... "Friends of Cap Coch Primary"

Secured UKG Shared Prosperity Funding to create a Community Garden. The volunteers worked with Customer Dealership Services in Motonovo Finance Cardiff 'to give back to the community' by volunteering to prepare the ground ready for laying the foundations for raised planters.

In September 2023 Landscapes for Learning began the work of renovating and creating the outdoor learning and planting pod. Work begins in early 2024 by Keep Wales Tidy and parent volunteers for the final stages of our community garden. Keep Wales Tidy provided £9000 of match funding for the Community Garden. We are hoping to have our grand opening at the end of March 2024.



Spotlight on.... "Valley Veterans"

In addition to Valley Veterans (Rhondda) current activities, the group have secured Welsh Church Act Funding of circa £46,000 to construct a Menage horse training area adjacent to their current community land. The development includes land preparation, drainage systems, fencing and surface area, and provides an exciting opportunity for the group to be able to allow residents access to equestrian-related facilities and therapy services which will benefit members and the wider community.

Valley Veterans Sectary said "I cannot express my gratitude to all in RCTCBC who supported us in receiving this news, thank you all for your help and support to us throughout this process. Of all the grant funding we have received, this one means the most as it will enable us to fulfil one of our members dreams of creating an equine area".

Work has now started on the land – watch this space!

Community Facilities Support Grant –



Sustainable Food Places – Revamping the Food Offer

Continues to provide an average of 150 subsided two-course mean per week to residents aged 50+.

Activities run daily from the venue including bingo, sewing, crochet, pilates, men's social group, Adult Community Learning & a Winter Welcome Centre

On the 7th December 2023, 75 residents attended the Christmas Lunch with pupils from Tonyrefail Community Schools attending to provide entertainment.
